At the age of thirty-five, Jennifer O'Toole was diagnosed with Asperger's Syndrome (autism), just after her three young children had been similarly identified. It was 2011, and for the first time in her life, things made sense.

They made so much sense, in fact, that now, Jennifer is the winner of the Autism Society of America's 2014 Outstanding Literary Work of the Year and the 2012 Temple Grandin Award for Outstanding Global Contributions, was named one of the 50 Most Influential Women in North Carolina and 25 Most Amazing Autistic Women, is a recipient of GRASP's Distinguished Spectrumite Parenting Medal and the Make-A-Wish Foundation's Women Inspiring Hope and Strength Award, was named AuKids Speaker of the Year, and has been celebrated by Disney's Babble and The Mighty. She is "Ask the Expert" columnist for healthline.com, sits on the Professional Panel of the Autism Society of America, and is a go-to editorialist/columnist for Amy Poehler's girl-power juggernaut, "Smart Girls at the Party."

From her own struggles and self-discovery, Jennifer has built an empire of empowerment. She's been invited to speak on Capitol Hill, and to the President's Council on Fitness at the White House Summit on Americans with Disabilities, was the Guest of Honor of Their Royal

Highnesses, the UK's Princess Sophie and Princess Marie of Denmark. Jennifer was named one of North Carolina's "50 Most Influential Women" and Autism Newscast's "25 Most Amazing Women with Autism," the cover story of "hope, humor & positivity" for Zoom Autism Magazine, a mentor for Yale's Child Study Center where her books serve as foundational texts, and a member of The Global Montessori Alliance.

She also had the privilege of consulting with the Children's Television Workshop on the creation of Sesame Street's first autistic character (oddly enough, a green-eyed, redheaded girl!). Jennifer's "Asperkids" Facebook Fan Page and blog have both been chosen by Disney/Babble to the Top 30 Autism Sites in the World.

O'Toole is an "Ask the Expert" columnist for <u>healthline.com</u>, a regular for *Autism Asperger's Digest* and *The Australian Autism Asperger's Network*, and contributes to *Autism Spectrum Quarterly* and "*Special*" Magazine among others. She has been featured by the BBC World Service, NBC, National Public Radio, Autism News Digest's

"Most Amazing Autistic Women," and "The Guardian," the United Kingdom's most widely- circulated newspaper.

O'Toole graduated with honors from Brown University and has since studied at the Graduate School of Social Work at Columbia University and Graduate School of Education at Queens University. Subsequent initiatives with young people garnered her an invitation to serve on North Carolina's Governor's Commission on Domestic Violence, and a nomination for Disney's American Teacher of the Year Award in her first year of teaching.
